Field Notes:

1. This butterfly makes a creaking sound when disturbed to ward off predators.

Answer: **Zebra Longwing**

2. Swallowtail mania! Name 3 different swallowtails.

Answer: **Eastern Tiger Swallowtail, Zebra Swallowtail, & Giant Swallowtail.**

3. North America's largest butterfly?

Answer: **Giant Swallowtail**

4. Females of this species are dimorphic. Some are yellow. Others are brown.

Answer: **Eastern Tiger Swallowtail.**

5. Larvae of this butterfly eat only at night, hiding during the day, away from food source.

Answer: **Great Spangled Fritillary.**

6. This butterfly gets its name from the "dog-like" markings on its forewings.

Answer: **Southern Dogface**

7. With the development of San Francisco, this butterfly became extinct. Last seen in March of 1943.

Answer: **Xerces Blue**

8. By mimicking the Monarch, this butterfly avoids being eaten by birds and other vertebrates.

Answer: **Viceroy**
